Rockland Harbor Trail: A public footpath of more than four miles that connects the major waterfront points of interest along the historic waterfront of Rockland Harbor. It is still being developed and the trail can be joined at any point. It starts at Sharps Point and follows the gravel path and city street along Atlantic St to the bricked path at Sandy Beach. Follow along on the Boardwalk to Harbor Park. Across Harbor Park and below the Police Station and up the hill to join Park Street. Walk right to the junction with Tillson Avenue. Cross over and go down Captain Spear drive to the Schooner Basin. Follow the gravel path to the left and across the parking lot to Glovers Passage and right on Main Street. You are now walking on the sidewalk along Route 1. You will have to cross the street to keep on the sidewalk. Just past US Cellular the route forks right and follow along that beside the Harbor until it loops back to Route 1. Walk along the side of Route 1 to Waldo Avenue, turn right

and walk along to Samoset Road which leads you along the edge of the Harbor to the base of the Rockland Breakwater and the walkout, 8/10th of a mile, to the Rockland Breakwater Lighthouse.

Schooner Bay Taxi, 207-594-2000, is happy to drive you there or back, \$5 in town per ride. They suggest calling from part way back along the Breakwater to schedule a pick up.
